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Minutes of the Parish Council meeting held on Monday 9th June 2025 at 7.30 pm at Old School, Hope.

028/25 **Public participation**

.1 Emily Gait outlined her role as the lead on the Move More Hope Valley Project, working for Hope Valley Climate Action. The project is funded by HPBC (though working within High Peak and Derbyshire Dales) and is looking at ways to encourage and inspire residents to be more active by exploring what is happening at the moment and what the barriers are. The project is about facilitating and signposting but not delivering projects.

Introduction events were held at the Heart of Hathersage on 7/6/25 and Edale Country Show on 8/6/25. These were an opportunity to begin getting ideas. Suggestions received were family friendly cycle groups, park runs (at present there are no park runs in the Hope Valley) and footpath repairs. Emily was interested to hear what is happening at the moment in Hope, what challenges there are and what existing groups are in the village that could be approached. She is also looking at making connections with the local schools and older generation.

Councillors passed on some ideas of activities including mountain biking skills workshops, and current challenges (lack of a joined up approach between buses and trains).

Emily stated that the next step is a workshop where residents can put forward ideas. Councillors directed her to the possibility of a stall at Hope Wakes Week and Hope Show.

Emily was thanked for attending the meeting and providing information about the project.

.2 Lorna Jackson raised concerns about the number of hedgehog deaths on Castleton Road in the Hope Valley College area and requested support from the Parish Council in asking DCC for hedgehog road signs that would hopefully raise awareness.

Lorna has been in contact with the Hope Wildlife Group who provided information from a 2018 survey. In 2023 legislation was changed to make it easier for County Councils to install wildlife signs. Councillors unanimously supported the request and felt that this was an opportunity for a community engagement project to raise awareness of hedgehog habitats and reporting sightings to the national database.

It was **agreed** that Hope Wildlife Group would be asked to draft a letter to DCC outlining why signs are needed in Hope, and the Clerk would forward this to DCC.

029/25 Safer Neighbourhood Team report

The main concerns of residents are speeding and noisy motorbikes. The motorbike operation is continuing, and a recent knife amnesty was productive.

There was no crime in Hope in May 2025 though there was a sudden death in a public place off Edale Road.

030/25 .1 District Councillor report

High Peak are posting information about the local government reorganisation on its website as and when it is known.

Cllr Perkins stated that this information is clear and useful, though concerns were raised that once

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there are north and south Derbyshire authorities, councillors might become less accessible, and communications will need to be improved.

.2 County Councillor report

DCC is now led by the Reform Party, but at the moment this hasn't affected policy. The first full council meeting in May appointed the council's cabinet, but no policy changes were made.

At the moment, it looks like a new combined authority will be elected in May 2027. This new authority will replace both the borough council and county council. As borough council elections are due in 2027, it will cease to exist naturally at that point. He understands that the idea of a combined authority that follows the current DCC boundaries has been dropped, and the most likely outcome is a North Derbyshire/South Derbyshire split. At the moment, there are no changes proposed to the responsibilities of PDNPA.

Action – Cllr Perkins to write to Cllr Gourley to thank him for the report.

It was suggested that Jubilee Corner could become a feature of the village if investment is made, such as planting a commemorative tree, and that councillors should take time in the coming month to look at the area.
